EXTENDED DAY PROGRAM


An extended day care program is available for students from 3:30-6:00PM. The cost is \$450 for the whole program or \$25 per day for drop-ins. Snacks are provided.

ACADEMIC CLASSES

Students will be studying grade level math and English. The curriculum will reinforce skills learned, as well as, introducing new skills and concepts. The goal of the academic courses is for students to practice specific skill activities through practical exercises.

English

Students will learn and practice comprehension and thinking strategies to enhance reading comprehension and critical thinking.

Math

Students will practice grade level math computations as well as learn new concepts and problem-solving skills. Students will learn through direct instruction, manipulatives, worksheets, and class discussions.

FIELD TRIPS & WATER PLAY DAY

All 1st - 5th grade students will have the opportunity to go on two class field trips during weeks 2 and 4. And during week 5, there will be a fun water play day at school.



3D BEADING

3D beading can be challenging, but it is also a unique skill to learn. Not everyone wears jewelry, but who wouldn't want a 3D beaded version of their favorite animal or object. In this class, students will be making 3D objects and animals using beads and turning these projects into pins, keychains, and other decorative forms. This is a 3 hr. class for 5th grade. (6 students minimum)

BERKELEY CHESS

Chess is fun! It can be learned quickly and easily. Chess helps improve critical cognitive skills such as concentration, spatial intelligence, and problem solving. Beyond academia, chess influences social behavior including self-esteem, respect for others, patience, and good sportsmanship. Our classes include instruction and supervised and guided play. (7 students minimum)

BOARD GAME STRATEGIES

We will be learning and analyzing the popular board game, Settlers of Catan. The goal of the game is to be the first to get ten victory points by building and collecting resources. This game will teach students how to plan and react to a board of resources based on probability, human error, negotiations, and strategic predictions. Students will learn a variety of strategies and their effectiveness in any given set up. The game will teach students probabilistic thinking as well as risk assessment; this class will help students develop a tactful way of thinking that will be useful not only in the classroom but also in social networking. (6 students minimum)



CHINESE CALLIGRAPHY

This is a fun cultural beginners course that teaches children how to paint characters, use a calligraphy brush, and create variation in writing characters. This course is suitable for all students from all backgrounds and a great opportunity to study Chinese calligraphy and build Chinese vocabulary. (6 students minimum)

CLAY SCULPTING

Sculpture is a form of 3D art created from materials being molded together. In this class, students will be learning basic sculpting skills to create a variety of animals, plants and vegetables using clay. This skill may also help students create characters and figurines for school projects, like dioramas. This is a 1.5 hour class for 3rd and 4th grades. (6 students minimum)

COOKING

1st and 2nd graders will practice simple measuring, spreading, stirring, and slicing skills while preparing their own delicious treats. Each day's recipe will correlate to a children's book that will be read aloud to the class. Students will learn food preparation skills to make their own snacks at home.

3rd and 4th graders will follow a written recipe to produce a baked good, sometimes a personal treat, other times they will share in making a group recipe. They will practice skills such as kneading dough, cracking eggs, and folding ingredients. They will also identify a variety of ingredients, accurately measure fractional parts of cups, tablespoon, and teaspoon, and learn basic food and kitchen safety. Students will enjoy cooking and baking. (6 students minimum)



MARVEGOS FINE ART

Marvegos is an award-winning art program that focuses on exercising creativity with projects appropriate for every age group. Engaging projects using quality fine art materials is the signature of The Marvegos. (4 students minimum & 14 students maximum)

1st and 2nd grade students will develop an understanding of basic concepts and terminology used in fine art making, while exploring a variety of media in these 1.5 hour classes. Visit www.marvegos.com for examples of students' work.

3rd and 4th grade students will create works that utilize drawing and mixed media and ceramics. Students are challenged with more developed projects applying "composition" and "form" in these 1.5 hour classes. Clay/ceramics, printmaking, and mixed media will be explored this week.

5th grade students will create works on paper utilizing drawing, painting, mixed media as well as a ceramics project. The three hour class allows greater development of projects that provides many opportunities for fifth grade students to think and create outside the box.






SPORTS CAMP

Sports camp is geared to incorporate a variety of different outdoor games and activities that will focus on and emphasize teamwork, communication, strategy, physical exercise, and most importantly fun! Some sports skills will also be introduced and used for games (basketball, soccer, and volleyball) as is appropriate for each grade level. Come prepared to learn, play, and have a great time with fellow students. (6 students minimum)

STEM USING LEGO®

GEOGRAPHY & CULTURE

Students will learn about countries on the seven continents. Each student will select a country and research basic information to share with the group. Through the use of google translator we will learn to say "hello" in each country's language. Students will learn about geography & cultures through games and other activities as well. Teacher will provide samples of food from each country presented. Students will improve their knowledge of where countries are located by continent, as well as become exposed to customs, dress, language, and food from a variety of continents. (7 students minimum)

HANDS ON SCIENCE

Students will complete "fairy-tale" themed hands on science and engineering activities through conducting simple experiments and building structures. Students will also collect and record data, as well as go through the process of planning, building, testing, making changes, and retesting. (6 students minimum)

M-POWER YOUTH MARTIAL ARTS

This is a fun, informal martial arts program empowering students to find their strength - inside and out. Incorporating both physical and awareness training, students will practice various strength and agility exercises and self-defense techniques to help build their confidence, mindfulness, and physical ability. Marla Lee, a 3rd degree black belt in Taekwondo and a 2nd degree black belt in Karate, will be the instructor. (7 students minimum)
