MATH CLASSES

Survey of Fundamental Middle School Mathematics (6th Grade) Session #1 (8:45 to 10:15AM)

This course aims to introduce the fundamentals of 6th grade core mathematical concepts with coverage on conceptual understanding of arithmetic operations, fractions, expressions and equations, ratios and proportional relationships, and basic geometric analysis. Concepts will be reinforced through practice in problem solving to develop procedural fluency and application.

Pre-Algebra and Algebra Conceptual Development and Problem Solving (7th & 8th Grades)

Session #2 (10:30AM to 12:00PM)

This course aims to expose students to basic and advanced problem solving skills with focal practice on Algebraic concepts. Major topics will include a review of fundamental math concepts learned in 6th grade, basic number theory, linear equations and functions, ratios and proportions, rates, and complex geometric analysis.

LANGUAGE CLASSES

Language Arts II with an emphasis on Writing (7th & 8th Grades) Session #1 (8:45 to 10:15AM)

This course will focus on increasing complexity of writing. Expository and persuasive writing will be the focused modes of writing. The Jane Schaffer writing method will also be taught to enhance students' abilities to structure their ideas. Multiple styles of writing will also be examined to broaden understanding of how various genres and styles communicate messages differently. This course will be a writing/research workshop as opposed to the traditional self-contained classroom.

Language Arts I with an emphasis on Writing (6th Grade) Session #2 (10:30AM to 12:00PM)

This course will focus on three aspects of language arts: reading, writing, and grammar. The focus will primarily be on how to find information, understand it, and articulate the student's opinion on the subject in an informed manner. One of the keystone strategies and resources that will be taught is the Jane Schaffer writing method. Writing emphasis will be on how to form a thesis, how to defend that thesis, and how to do research. Students will also practice proper grammar in improving sentences and paragraphs to create more effective essays. Creative writing will also be utilized to help with writing fluency.

STUDY HALL

Session #1 or Session #2

Students will be supervised in a quiet environment where they can study, read, and work on self-directed projects. Study hall is only available in conjunction with an academic class.





BOARD GAME STRATEGIES

We will be learning and analyzing the popular board game, Settlers of Catan. The goal of the game is to be the first to get ten victory points by building and collecting resources. This game will teach students how to plan and react to a board of resources based on probability, human error, negotiations, and strategic predictions. Students will learn a variety of strategies and their effectiveness in any given set up. The game will teach students probabilistic thinking as well as risk assessment; this class will help students develop a tactful way of thinking that will be useful not only in the classroom but also in social networking. (6 students minimum)

CHINESE CALLIGRAPHY

This is a fun cultural beginners course that teaches children how to paint characters, use a calligraphy brush, and create variation in writing characters. This course is suitable for all students from all backgrounds and a great opportunity to study Chinese calligraphy and build Chinese vocabulary. (6 students minimum & 18 maximum)

COOKING

Middle School students will be introduced to complex recipes of multiple cuisines. Food safety and training to use kitchen tools will be taught. Teamwork will be a must. Together the students will learn things like how to plan and prepare a multi-course meal, how to balance a menu, and learn nutritional information in common food items. Emphasis will be on homemade dishes such as pasta, bread, and sauces. Menus will be shaped around recipes and skills that the students can then easily bring back to their homes and continue to use. Foods from both American and Asian cuisines, as well as breakfast, lunch and dinner, will all be utilized. (6 students minimum & 14 maximum)



GEOGRAPHY & CULTURES

Students will learn about countries on the seven continents. Each student will select a country and research basic information to share with the group. Through the use of google translator we will learn to say "hello" in each country's language. Students will learn about geography & cultures through games and other activities as well. Teacher will provide samples of food from each country presented. Students will improve their knowledge of where countries are located by continent, as well as become exposed to customs, dress, language, and food from a variety of continents. (7 students minimum)

MARVEGOS FINE ART

Marvegos is an award winning art program that focuses on individual creativity. This 3 hour class will challenge Middle School students with more developed projects applying "composition" and "form" to exercise creativity. Clay and ceramics, printmaking, and mixed media will be explored this week. Visit www.marvegos.com for examples of students' work. (4 students minimum & 14 students maximum)

SPORTS CAMP

Sports camp is geared to incorporate a variety of different outdoor games and activities that will focus on and emphasize teamwork, communication, strategy, physical exercise, and most importantly fun! Soccer, basketball, volleyball, and other team games will be played. Come prepared to learn, play, and have a great time with fellow students. (6 students minimum)

3D BEADING

3D beading can be challenging, but it is also a unique skill to learn. Not everyone wears jewelry, but who wouldn't want a 3D beaded version of their favorite animal or object. In this class, students will be making 3D objects and animals using beads and turning these into pins, key chains, and other decorative forms. (6 students minimum)
